### News from Upper Poppleton Parish Council

### From Chairman Neil Lawrence

### **August Meeting**

The summer months are generally a quiet time for the Parish Council. Normally there is no meeting in August but this year we made an exception and held a short meeting to discuss some planning applications. Back to normal in September.

### **Merged Councils**

Little progress has been made on grouping the two Parish Councils. In early August all the City of York Councillors received an email from the Parish Councils working group, which included a document which explained the historical timeline. On the same day a mail was also sent to City officials. This included the same document as sent to the councillors and also a sample 'grouping order' which could be used as the basis for the eventual legal document. These actions were done to try and speed up the process. Replies have been received from some city councillors. We wait and see if this action will lead to anything positive.

### **Biodiversity**

The Environment Act 2021 placed a duty on all local authorities to take biodiversity into account in decisions and actions. The consequences of the biodiversity requirements will become more apparent in future decision making and also requires the Parish Council to develop a proper biodiversity policy. More about this in the future.



# **Out o' Space Project Update**

### Fund Hits £230,000

We reported in the last edition of Centrepiece that



the Out o' Space Project, to significantly enlarge The Centre to ensure it's able to satisfy the needs of the village in the future, had just topped £200,000 and we are delighted to say that we have now secured a grant of £20,000 from the National Lottery Fund. This, along with Par-

ish Council grants for 2024, and a donation from local store NISA, takes the total fund up to £230.000 - a huge step towards the £300,000+ that we need.



### **Boost from Garden Trail**

The Poppleton Garden Trail in late July gave aother boost to the fund, raising just over £4,000. Some 850 visitors toured the 14 open gardens during the weekend and it was not only a great fundraiser but a really lovely community event. # **Remembering Austin Wright**

A plaque to celebrate the significant post-war sculptor Austin Wright, whose personal and professional lives were deeply intertwined with Upper Poppleton and the wider city, was unveiled in Poppleton as part of the village's May Children's Sports Day celebrations.

Wright, who lived from 1934 to 1997, made sculptures using different types of materials, but mostly aluminium. His sculptures are in many national collections, including the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, the Tate, and the National Museum of Wales. Some of his most recognised works are located at the University of York.

From the 1960s onwards, his art found new direction from interest in plant forms. He drew particular inspiration from his garden in Poppleton

which also became an exhibition space, with large aluminium works to be found among trees and fauna. The plaque is therefore at Green View, on the Green: his home, studio and inspiration.

The Wright plaque is the first blue plaque outside of the city's ring road. It's one of over 150 blue plaques in the city erected by York Civic Trust, a membership organisation whose other plaques include the first 'rainbow' plaque in the world (Anne Lister, aka "Gentleman Jack") and the only 'stained-glass' blue plaque (Lawrence Sterne).

The plaque was unveiled by the newly crowned "May Queen" and was at-

tended by around 100 people – a record for a Civic Trust blue plaque unveiling – and included Austin's son, Crispin Wright, and University of York's Art Curator, Helena Cox (pictured, above), who both gave insights into the life and work of Austin.

A single, grouped Parish Council will undoubtedly be more efficient. Given CYC's parlous financial position, as evidenced by the introduction of garden waste charges, for example, one would hope that they would have the foresight to see the benefits of assisting us with this work.

### **Meeting and AGM** 1 May 2024

The format of the evening was firstly the talk: "Inside China: Living on the economy of China" by Jane McKeown, followed by the AGM. Jane's modest description of herself was: "Combines a very large family with the research ethics of generations of journalists on both sides".

She first described the book, '1421: the year China discovered the world', by Gavin Menzies, a retired Royal Navy Submarine Commanding Officer born in 1937 in China. He served from 1959 to 1970 and sailed the world in the wake of Columbus, Dias, Cabral and Vasco de Gama. He also followed the routes of Magellan and Cook. In his research of 1421 he visited 120 countries, over 900 museums and libraries and major seaports of the late Middle Ages.

In brief, Menzies proposes that the Chinese had circumnavigated the world a century before Magellan, reached America seven-



ty years before Columbus and fifty years before Cook. On 8 March 1421 a vast Chinese fleet. some ships nearly 500 feet long, sailed under the command of Emperor Zhu Di's loval eunuch admirals.

Their task was: 'to proceed all the way to the ends of the earth'.

The voyages lasted two years but on return China was reduced to self-imposed isolation from the world and the ships left to rot and written records destroyed. The latest evidence describes an entire Chinese fleet wrecked on
