Stuart Robson - long time supporter of The Centre



Stuart was a long time supporter of the Centre and sadly passed away on 3rd January this year, writes Robin Tomlinson.

At a well-attended memorial service in All Saints church in the village on 31st January Stuart's wife Lal and son Richard gave a fascinating recollection of Stuart's life. Stuart was an accomplished sportsman in his youth playing hockey, lacrosse, and cricket. He played cricket at school to county level, his love of cricket staying with him until much later in his life. He went to study at Newcastle university which

led to him joining the dental profession. He moved to York to take up a partnership in a dental practice in Blossom Street, later becoming Robson, Nicholson and Alpin which was built into a very successful practice. He involved himself in the administration of the dental profession eventually becoming President of the British Dental Association.

Stuart was also a keen sailor, but it was his love of cricket which lead to his involvement in the recent move to revive Village cricket in Poppleton. With no funding and with no ground to play on, Stuart enlisted the

help of Ian Gillies, by now a city of York Councillor and between them they obtained an agreement from a planning inspector that S106 funding from the housing development on the British Sugar site should be directed towards new cricket facilities to replace those lost because of the new development, and that funding should go to cricket in Poppleton. This development has been delayed by a number of years and so Stuart decided to start cricket development by introducing youth cricket in the village. He formed a working party with representation from City of York Council, the Parish Councils, Yorkshire County Cricket club, Poppleton Community Trust and a number of interested local people. The junior teams, both boys and girls, played for two seasons at local venues but with a home for cricket still some time away and playing venues becoming difficult to find it was decided to put the club into limbo and its assets were transferred to the care of the Community Trust where they now reside to be used for Cricket development when the BSC site comes to fruition. Sadly both Stuart and Ian Gillies will not see that happen.

Following his retirement Stuart joined the Upper Poppleton Parish Council, eventually becoming Chairman, a position he held until a couple of years before his death. During his time as a Parish Councillor Stuart remained a staunch supporter of the Poppleton Centre, regularly enjoying a coffee and catch up with Beth the Centre Manager and various Trustees.

His enthusiasm for the good of this village and particularly the Centre will be sorely missed.

Out o' Space Project Update



Phase One Has Started

Phase 1 started at the beginning of January when the diggers arrived and contractor Chris Cook's team started to clear out the shrubs alongside the tennis courts at the side of the building. We're adding at ground floor level two multi-use studios with sprung floors to accommodate not only dance and fitness but meetings and parties, too. General access will be from around the side of the building. We anticipate that work will be completed in August at an estimated cost of £320,000.

At the same time a Padel Court and

Pétanque Rink will be created, funded by a S106 grant from City of York Council/Miller Homes at an estimated cost of £100,000.

Tennis Clubhouse

All this will be closely followed by Phase 2, the creation of a new clubhouse for Poppleton Tennis Club on the far side of the tennis courts enabling Poppleton Social to be enlarged, providing more café/bar space and improved access to outside seating. Estimated cost £350,000.

Phase 3 to follow?

Phase 3 has yet to be confirmed. The original plan to build upstairs rooms and facilities, accessible via a lift and stairs, has been shelved for the time being as has the initiative to accommodate Explore Library into the Centre complex. If funding becomes available we can develop the Centre building accordingly. Estimated cost £450,000.

Work on adding new rooms to your community centre building has started - but we still need to raise funding for the development of the Poppleton Social space and it's not too late to add your and your families' names to the new building to help us hit our next target. Over 200 names have already secured their place in Poppleton history - don't be left out.



What is a Lasting Power of Attorney?



"What if?..." ...there is a time when you are not able to make or communicate your own decisions, writes Neville Ward from Age UK York. Having a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) set up beforehand can make things much easier should that time come. The best time to make a LPA is when you don't need it.

A Lasting Power of Attorney is a legal framework to allow an individual (known as the Donor) to appoint one or more people they trust (known as Attorneys) to make decisions on their behalf. Anyone over 18 can make a LPA, provided they have the mental capacity to do so. There are a number of reasons why you might



need someone to make decisions on your behalf. It could be that you are concerned about going

into hospital or whether you might need care in the future. It could be you are starting to need help with completing everyday financial tasks such as paying your bills, going to the bank or the inevitable drift to things only being available either over the phone or online. LPAs might be part of your long-term planning. Maybe you are concerned should you ever become diagnosed with, say, dementia - or maybe you just like to be organised. LPAs enable you a way to plan ahead in case you are concerned about your ability to make your own decisions in the future.

Two types of LPA

There are two types of LPA, each of which has a different purpose: one for Property & Financial Affairs and one for Health & Welfare. Therefore, individuals can choose whether to have one or both. Individuals can add any preferences or instructions to make their LPA specific to themselves.

Help from Age UK

Age UK York have a free, impartial and confidential Information & Advice team who can help you understand LPAs, including outlining the options you have to put one in place.

It is possible for people to make and register their LPA themselves. Some people decide to pay for assistance (e.g. a solicitor, or some other professional). Age UK York also offer an additional chargeable service to assist people make and register their LPAs. (The fees for this additional service help cover incurred costs.)


River **Bank**

Ordinary Meeting 19 November 2024

The Ancient Walls of York and How they were Saved by Jonathan French

The speaker came to York in 1979 and on retirement became interested in the history of York. He is Chair of York Oral History Society and a council member of YAYAS.

The map showed the 'Defences of York' after William the Conqueror added ex-



tensions to the Roman fortress. The Walls and Gates served for defence, a statement of power, civic reputation as a Royal City, business security and for keeping people out. The gates also acted as custom posts.

However, as the city developed through the 17th century and into the 18th the walls became an impediment to traffic and in 1799 there was a petition to demolish them.

Strong opposition by two Archbishops and other influential people like William Etty and members of York Philosophical Society led to funding in 1827 which allowed a section of the



Walls between Micklegate Bar and North Street Postern to be repaired but the Corporation declined maintenance. Even as late as 1855 the Walls between Walmgate Bar and the Red Tower were considered for demolition.


The main problem over the years was 'accessibility' for the local population and visitors. The cattle market was outside the city walls and entry difficult. Slowly all the Barbicans were removed leaving just Walmgate as an historical example. Various breaches have improved matters. George Hudson, the Railway King brought coal to the trains through two arches in the mid 1800s. Victoria Bar was modified in 1838 and the whole walkway built in Victorian times. Erosion and weathering of the magnesian limestone continues to be a problem but current thinking is to preserve walls and gates carefully avoiding major intrusions.

The Junior Debating Team of St Peter's School, York made a good fist of both supporting the motion and defending it with a young Moderator keeping control. A vote taken before and after the debate did not move the audience to change their belief that Britain was more of a force for good than for oppression. The subject was very sensitive, particularly for older people but is included in the A-level History syllabus for September 2025.

Poets and Poems from 'Poppleton Sons of the Great War Remembered' plus 'The Silent Secret' poem by Sandra Hutson by Members of PHS


